



Culture Appreciation Lesson Plan

Need for activity:

Paper, and writing utensil

Introduction:

Introduce the lesson. This lesson can be done alone or an adult overseeing the lesson. The point of the lesson is to create a poem with the topic being culture appreciation. The teen can use their own culture or a culture they're interested in. If the teen doesn't know the meaning it is important they know the meaning of culture appreciation to be able to do this lesson. The teen is to create a short or long poem depending on their preference. The poem can rhyme, be used with instruments, used into lyrics for a song. The creativity can be endless and is encouraged to be as creative as possible.

Cultural appreciation is when elements of a culture are used while honoring the source they came from. It is important to note that appreciation involves respect and value.

Activity:

Now it's time to start activity! The teen should work individually. Create a space that is comfortable. Use your paper and writing utensils to create your culture appreciation poem. Use as much time as needed to finish. For inspiration google culture of your choice to get ideas, you can use your own culture traditions, use music or movies.

Conclusion:

Once the teen is done with the lesson. Share it with an adult, your friends, post it on social media. Not only is this great for the teen to express themselves and use creativity, but great to share with others your culture appreciation.
