



Culture Appreciation Lesson Plan

Need for activity:

Paper or worksheet provided, and writing utensils

Introduction

Introduce the lesson. This lesson can be done alone or an adult overseeing the lesson. The point of the lesson is to create a poem with the topic being culture appreciation. The child can use their own culture or a culture they're interested in. If the child doesn't know the meaning it is important they know the meaning of culture appreciation to be able to do this lesson. The child is to create a short or long poem depending on their preference. The poem can rhyme, be used with instruments, used into lyrics for a song. The creativity can be endless and is encouraged to be as creative as possible.

Cultural appreciation is when elements of a culture are used while honoring the source they came from. It is important to note that appreciation involves respect and value.

Activity:

Now it's time to start activity! The child will need to be provided with the worksheet we provided or if no printer use paper, and writing utensils. Use as much time as needed to finish. For inspiration google culture of your choice to get ideas, you can use your own culture traditions, use music or movies. Allow the child to work alone, always step in when help is needed. This is to be a fun activity!
